As the newly elected President of the Enlisted Association I am reaching out to you for your assistance. We have many challenges facing us over the next few years whether it is another round of base closures via the Base Realignment Commission (BRAC), reduction in TRICARE benefits, attempts to maintain the retirement age at 60, etc. We need a strong voice to put our message across to the State and Federal Legislators and this can only be accomplished through a strong membership in our State Association (EANG-NJ) and the National Association (EANGUS).

We have been tasked by the National (EANGUS) with a goal of 800 members. This should be attainable as the entire strength of the state is around 7,000. The new membership year started on 1 January 2008 and so far we have a little over 300 members and we sincerely need your help as we enter this New Year.

First and foremost we need the senior NCO leadership to sign on as members. If our senior NCOs lead the way the junior ranks will most assuredly follow your example.

**Message from the Vice President - Army

Membership

You should ask yourself, "Why join the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of New Jersey?" There are many reasons to join this Association. Our Association represents the men and women who form the Backbone of the Services. When our Association began it was known as the NCO Association. I can remember every Annual Training period I paid dues to the Association, as did every enlisted soldier in the pay line. Yes, we were paid in cash at the end of our 2 weeks of training. Our dues back then were \$5.00. The Association represented us on the many Federal and State legislative matters. Back then, we were trying to get National Guard License Plates and we were looking for better pay and benefits from the Department of Defense; benefits like Reenlistment Bonuses. Yes, that's right, Reenlistment Bonuses. The first bonus benefit was a \$1200.00 six year reenlistment bonus paid in 6 increments of \$200.00. A far cry from today's \$15,000.00 reenlistment bonus or \$20,000.00 enlistment bonus that our soldier's get today.

Our Association and EANGUS, our National Association, have continued to fight for better benefits for every member of the Guard. In the National Defense Appropriation Bill this year was a new Retirement Benefit. No longer do some of our members have to wait till age 60 to collect their retirement. Okay, it has some limitations, but it's a start. It reduces the age at which you can retire (from age 60) 90 days for every aggregate 90 days you are on active duty orders for a contingency operation or national emergency (Title 10 or Title 32) within your retirement year. The orders don't have to be for 90 days or more, but credit is given in 90-day chunks at the end of the retirement year when posting to your records. Bad news--the law is not retroactive, so time already spent on orders prior to January 28th doesn't count--YET. We will continue to fight to have Congress pass legislation to correct the oversight and Congress is ready to do just that.

Also the final National Guard Commission Report of the independent Commission on the National Guard and Reserves was released to news organizations on Thursday, January 31, at 10:00 a.m. in a "Newsmaker" event at the National Press Club. The report documents the results of a congressionally mandated examination, nearly two years long, of the seven reserve components of the U.S. military. The Commission sees "no reasonable alternative to the nation's continuing increased reliance on its reserve components" as an operational force for missions at home and abroad. The reserve components are under significant stress from ongoing operations in Iraq and Afghanistan, and the Commission believes that Congress and the Department of Defense must make major changes in laws, rules, regulations, personnel, and funding systems in order to sustain an operational reserve--an essential contributor to the health of the nation's all-volunteer military force--in the years to come. This report could bring landmark legislation that could radically change the shape and your benefits in the Guard. See the article in our legislative section. These are just a few issues our state and national associations are doing to improve and protect your benefits. Many of you are taking advantage of the free college tuition at state colleges and universities. Our Association fought hard for that benefit. We testified in front of the Assembly and Senate committee hearings. The original benefit only covered attaining a Bachelor's Degree now you can use the benefit to attain a Master's Degree or better. We are able to get these benefits through strength in numbers. **That is why you are so important to us.** So, asks yourself again, "**Do I really need to join the Enlisted Association today to keep the benefits I have today continued and get future benefits?**" The answer is clear and simple ----- Yes you do. THE HISTORY of EANG-NJ

The Army and Air National Guard Noncommissioned Officer's Association of New Jersey was first organized in 1965 as a chapter of the active Army NCO Association (NCOA) with headquarters in Fort Worth, Texas. Membership in the NCOA as limited to the Army National Guard. During the year 1971 the New Jersey Army National Guard severed their membership with the NCOA and elected to organize the Army and Air National Guard Noncommissioned Officer's Association under the leadership of then charter president, CSM Vincent Baldassari. A small group of dedicated individuals met at McGuire Air Force Base to develop what is now the present structure of the Association. One of the original organizers was the former Adjutant General, Major General Francis R. Gerard. Chief Master Sergeant Richard W. Spencer was elected the first President of the Association at the first conference held at the Sheraton-Deauville Hotel in Atlantic City, NJ in October 1971. The Constitution and By-Laws of the Association became an official document on 31 October 1971. The Army and Air National Guard Noncommissioned Officer's Association of New Jersey was one of the original charters established with the Enlisted Association National Guard United States (EANGUS), our national equivalent.

An historical event took place at the annual conference on 10 October 1992 when the membership voted to change the name of the Association to the Enlisted Association National Guard of New Jersey (EANG-NJ) by unanimous vote.

The following are some of the accomplishments for 2006 and 2007 that your membership in the State and National Associations have gained for both active and retired Guardsmen and women

2007 EANGUS Accomplishments:

- Pay raise of 3.5%
- Raise creditable retirement points from 90 to 130 per year
- Early retirement provisions -- 90days off age 60 for 90 aggregate days deployed
- Use of MGIB REAP benefits for 10 years after discharge
- IDT travel cost reimbursement in limited situations
- National Guard Empowerment Act provisions (except no seat on JCS or procurement authority)
- Repeal Insurrection Act changes
- No TRICARE fee or pharmacy increases
- Retain Mil Techs as non-dual status if combat injured and discharged
- Salute the flag when not in uniform
- Extend VA health care from 2 years to 5 years post-deployment
- Retain JCA program with Army and not transfer to Air Force
- Obtain funding for more C-17 aircraft

It is outstanding to have such support from NGANJ and EANG-NJ Executive Councils and membership as we move forward with our legislative efforts. We have enclosed some references for future use. We realize we are giving you an abundance of information at once but you will find it very useful in answering your legislative questions and how our legislative committee is working on getting our bills passed within the State Legislature and the Congress.

First, we urge you all to refer to the state legislative website: www.njleg.state.nj.us This site will assist you in doing any personal research about any state bill or state legislative representative. For instance on our committee we look for credentials of legislators, such as military service, alumni of universities. We constantly look to gain access to legislators to discuss our agenda. This site also identifies what bills Senate/Assembly committees have on their agenda, and what day's meetings are going to be held. As I spoke at our last years Annual Business meeting we must attend these meetings regularly, I am really depending on our retired members to help us show a presence at these meetings. I would encourage attendees to wear something that identifies them with our organization as uniforms are unauthorized when lobbying. They wouldn't even have to say anything at the meeting just present to the Assembly or Senate committee that we are watching and we are engaged. I can also send out meeting reminders to those interested in joining our email distribution. The state legislative site is very good, and I urge you to use it. If you want to track our Association agenda items, there are means to do so on this web-site and you will be sent an e-mail every time there is action on our bills.

The other web-sites I am providing for you deal primarily with federal bills, TRICARE, Retirement at 55, Survivor Benefit Plan etc. First please refer to both the NGAUS and EANGUS legislative sites. www.ngaus.org/legislative/legislative.asp and www.eangus.org/legislative/default.asp Sign up for their legislative alerts and pass this on to your soldiers and airmen. Please cc me when you do this, so our committee knows word is getting out there to the field. The toll free number to contact your federal representatives is 1-888-642-8799. The final two sites I would refer you too are The Government Accounting Office (GAO) www.gao.gov/docsearch/app_processform.php These reports provide the information congress makes decisions on, it is important to understand the issues inside and out before lobbying or calling. Finally one of the better tools out there is the NGB Legislative Liaison web-site www.ngb.army.mil/ll which provides an in depth analysis of the bills which we have concern . We have to educate ourselves in order to influence our decision makers. For those that may not be very computer friendly please contact the committee by phone and we will be happy to assist.

You have competent and trained a joint-committee of comprised of Enlisted, Officers, Army and Air, Active and Retirees. Both Association Presidents have appointed me as the chairperson in writing. Our committee received training on the state legislative process from a member of the NJ State Legislature Office of Legislative Services, who was the former aide to the Assembly Military and Veterans Affairs committee for five years. They were also provided an extensive legislative reference packet which outlined the procedure in the Congress and analysis of current legislative issues. Members of the committee attended both the NGAUS and EANGUS legislative training conference, which we have enclosed our report. I am very proud to the chair of such a hard working team, these are members with specialized skills and expertise that we rely on often. I would like to recognize CPT Barbara Brown-Wilson 1LT Richard Colton (Army) 2LT April Kelly (Air) MSG (Ret) Louis DeVico (Army) SGM (Ret) Robert Landolfi (Army) 1LT Robert Burd (Army) SGM (Ret) Jerome Zebrowski (Army) unfortunately for the association Mr. Lou Mancuso is leaving the committee as I wish him and his wife Jo the best as he retires to Arizona in the coming year, he has been an inspiration to me and a driving force behind our success.

Our committee has sorted through over 60 State bills to narrow the focus to a few state bills and three Federal priorities which we have enclosed in our published legislative agenda. Our main objectives this year Federally are providing retirement at 55, PTSD legislation, and passage of National Guard Empowerment Act. State issues include establishing a separate military affairs committee, VET is a VET legislation and incorporating Traditional drilling National Guard Service to be available for purchase in NJ State PERS.

Highlights of our Accomplishments are:

- Passing into law State bill S532 providing National Guard Students the right to re-enroll without financial penalty if called to active duty during the academic year.
 - Passing into law State bill S250, which excludes housing and subsistence allowances from the taxable gross income for members of the National Guard on state active duty.
 - Committee has attained eight of the thirteen members Congressional House Delegation to co-sponsor bill HR558 and both Senators to co-sponsor bill S337, in which both pieces of legislation provide reduced receipt of retirement, and healthcare benefits to all members of the National Guard and Reserves. New Jersey leads the United States with the highest co-sponsorship percentage.
 - PASSED Rep. Jim Saxton introduced language in National Defense Authorization bill that would provide retirement points to all NJ National Guard Members who served in Hudson, Bergen, Middlesex and Union counties on State Active Duty in support of 9/11
 - The committee's leadership urged the generation of and personally delivered over 30,000 letters from friends, family and members of our State Association. These letters focused on Saving the Flying mission of the 108th Air Refueling Wing from DOD Base Alignment and Closure Commission recommendations to de-activate 16 KC 135E model aircraft. The Commission ultimately decided the unit will now receive the eight new KC-135R model aircraft.
- TRICARE PASSED / Fees Frozen
- The passage of NGAUS requested NJ Assembly Resolution 282 which urges the passage of HR558 (TRICARE and Retirement) This resolution was read into the Congressional record.
 - Committee attained thirteen members of our fifteen members Congressional Delegation to co-sponsor HR558 and its Senate counter-part S337, both pieces of legislation provide reduced receipt of retirement and healthcare benefits to all members of the National Guard and Reserves. New Jersey leads the United States with the highest co-sponsorship for this issue.
 - Amended State legislation to include retirees for hunting, fishing and park passes
 - Congress restored funding to 350,000 soldiers, participating in congressional press conferences
 - Organize and host Annual Legislative Dinner with many Congressional Staffers
